This project involved serving as Cleveland City Council's representative to the 5-year, \$1.45 billion dollar expansion of Cleveland Hopkins International Airport. This Project - with its nearly 150 subprojects - created a new era for air travel in Northeast Ohio.

This project required monitoring of three areas that were most critical to Council: schedule, budget and EEO compliance. We reported directly to the Council leadership on the Project status and workforce diversity - including a reporting role on legislative oversight and policy initiatives.

Proprietary software and information systems were developed - permitting real-time interaction with Cleveland's Dept. of Port Control on the developments that were in various phases of programming, planning and construction.

Three of the subprojects to this project were: the City's Residential Sound Insulation Program, involving a total of over 4,000 homes at a cost of over \$100 million; construction of the new \$50 million CHIA Parking Garage; and, the \$150 million Continental Airlines Expansion - including its new Concourse D required for CAL's hub operation for state-of-the-art regional jet service.



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
